Regulation Impact Statement for Consultation: Energy Efficiency Policy Options for Heat Pump Water Heaters

AFMA members include many of the major participants in Australia's environmental product markets, including the Small-scale Technology Certificate (STC), Victorian Energy Upgrades (VEU) Scheme and NSW's Energy Savings Scheme (ESS).

Key Points

 Ensure communication and collaboration with state-based schemes to minimise any market impact.

AFMA's submission focuses on the potential impact of these changes on commonwealth and state-based environmental products markets.

We support the intent to introduce a minimum energy performance standard (MEPS) with a measurement approach as an opportunity to harmonise standards across state-based and commonwealth environmental product schemes. We agree this has the potential to lower the regulatory burden and potentially costs over the long term.

AFMA urges DCCEEW to work with state government and scheme regulators to minimise any disruption to the STC, VEU and ESS markets caused by the introduction of MEPS.
